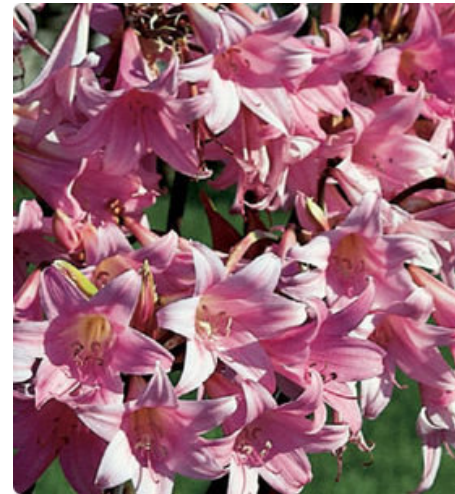
This exceptional stand of daffodils (narcissus) exists in a field a short drive from the Leipers Fork village.

**Lycoris Radiata
(red spider lily)**

Multiflowering, bright red flowers. Strap-shaped green foliage disappears in July; flower spike bursts forth in August. Grow in cool greenhouses, outdoors in warmer areas where little or no frost is experienced. *In zones lower than 7, apply winter cover. Bulb size: 10+ cm, Aug-Sep., 18"



Narcissus "Love Call"

The two, overlapping layers of milky-white perianth of this lovable variety are offset perfectly by its butterfly-like, ruffled, golden-orange cup segments. Bulb size: 14/16 cm. April. 16"

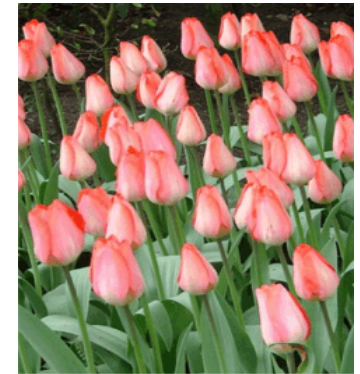

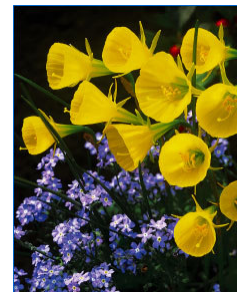

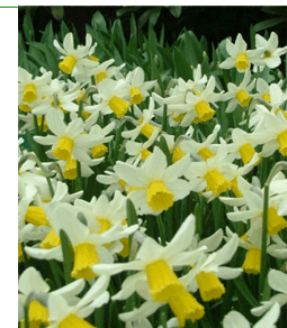

Narcissus "Hillstar"

Hillstar yields two to three, bright lemon-yellow, 2 1/2" flowers per stem with ivory bases and funnel-shaped, ivory-white cups. Bulb size: 12/14 cm. May. 14" to 16".

Narcissus "Hawera"

Circa 1910, this bright, red award-winner is the best, early red forcer. Bulb size: 16/17 cm. April. 8" to 12".

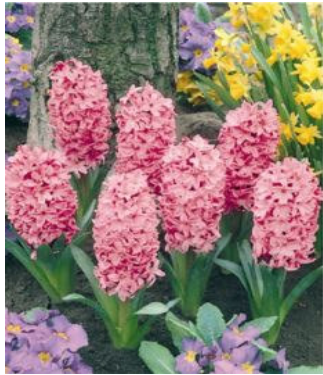

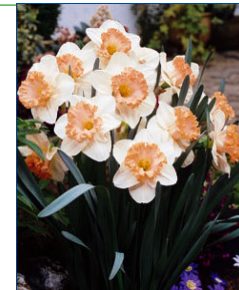

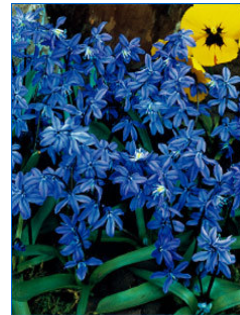

Iphieon Uniflorum "Wisley Blue"

Syn: the Spring Starflower, Triteleia uniflorum. Circa 1836, these sweet scented flowers are shimmering blue. Bulb size: 4 cm/up. April/May. 3" to 6".

Planted in a partially shaded & sheltered location, lily flowering tulips like these will bloom for up to three years in Leipers Fork. This year, we are featuring the red & white lily-flowering tulip, "Marylin", and vibrant red perennial Darwin Hybrid Tulip, "Holland's Glory" See page three for information.



Lycoris are known as "surprise lilies" because of the way they pop up unexpectedly in late summer when almost nothing else is in bloom. The foliage dies off long before the blooms appear. This year, we are featuring red and pink Lycoris for the first time. See page fifteen for details.



This bunny may like the daffodils, but the real bunnies won't bother them. That is one reason why daffodils (narcissus) are so easy to grow around here. Deer, squirrels and rabbits don't eat them.
